5. A meeting of the Interahamwe committees of the PVK took place during the evening of Friday 25/02/94 at the permanent Mission of the MRND in Kimihurura. This meeting was chaired by Robert Jerry Kajuga and after long and difficult discussions, the following decisions were taken and applied from 26/02/94 onwards.
 - given that FPR has infiltrated certain neighbourhoods, increased vigilance is required and everything must be done to draw up a list of infiltrating individuals.
 - they may meet at any time during the night by virtue of a system of whistles and codenames.
 - they shall be ready at any time of the day or night to emerge with "blade weapons" and to provide weapons to trained soldiers.
 - they shall intervene in favour of the Impuzamugambi and the Inkuba (young people of the MDR) if one of them has problems.
 - they shall call a secret number so that all the information is rapidly transmitted to the Interahamwe of the PVK.
 - they shall not associate with looters and miscreants acting in the name of the Interahamwe.
6. The principal intermediary for the supply of arms to the FAR is allegedly Philippe Chaterat, the former director of the Banque Populaire of Rwanda of Swiss origin, who has long-standing close ties with the Minister of Defence, Bizimungu. He is currently an international adviser and works for the World Bank, among other things. A large quantity of arms was supposedly purchased from the Unita fighters just before the creation of the GOM, with these arms temporarily stored at the military base of Kamina in Zaire. They were then taken in the direction of Goma and were transported in the dead of night to the barracks at Gisenyi. They simply transited by military lorries between Gisenyi and Kigali. All of the invoices were paid in dollars by the Governor of the BNR, Mr. Ntirugirizumbazi, whose bank mandate had long since expired but who is kept in place by the president himself. According to our sources, the documents on this point are kept at EM FAR.
