Who declared to us that:

- He was Head of the Belgian Co-operants' Section in Kigali.
- His neighbour was Captain Kabera of the Presidential Guard.
- From Thursday 07.04.94 to Saturday morning 09.04.94, Captain Kabera, his family and some soldiers held a non-stop party at their home.
- A vehicle loaded with soldiers regularly visited the Captain before leaving again for the city. According to the servants, these soldiers were carrying out massacres in the city.
- Again according to the servants, Captain Kabera had had his immediate neighbours at 2 Avenue de la Jeunesse killed; these were neighbours with whom he did not get on. Captain Kabera, meanwhile, lived at 4 Avenue de la Jeunesse. The act was carried out on the morning of 08.04.94.
- At about 0900 hours on 07.04.94, a Tutsi family hiding in the French village was massacred by soldiers; they were people who regularly visited Captain Kabera.
- Captain Kabera organised barriers in his district, with robberies and murders perpetrated against the people who arrived there. (*highlighted*)
- Captain Kabera had already been mentioned in a report concerning human rights. (*highlighted*)
- Mr Schriewer remembers seeing, on Sunday 10.04.94, at the Chancery of the Belgian Embassy in Kigali, a fax sent from the FAR MA in which it was mentioned that:
 - 1) The FAR MA acknowledged its liability in the murder of the 10 Belgian blue berets.
 - 2) The act was committed by government soldiers.
 - 3) An investigation committee would be set up and the perpetrators would be punished.
- This fax had been left at the Belgian Embassy in Kigali and must have arrived between Thursday 7 and Saturday 9 April.
