**MEMO N° 17 TO BERNARD CAZENEUVE**

In his interview, Prefect Dewatre indicated to us that the “*DGSG had a person with Mr Paul Kagamé throughout the Turquoise operation*” (page 252 of the directory of military reports).

On his part, Prefect Silberzahn indicated to us that “*during these years the information principally came from Uganda where the DGSE was then present and established*” (page 243).

Lastly, Prefect Dewatre declared that “*on 8 April 1994, an agent of the DGSE arrived in Kigali*” (page 252).

The DGSE was therefore apparently on site to gather evidence on the perpetrators of the attack of 6 April against the Falcon 50, including in the hypothesis of FPR responsibility. And yet, according to Prefect Dewatre, it allegedly had no means of deciding among the various hypotheses.
